I catch my prey with my beak.

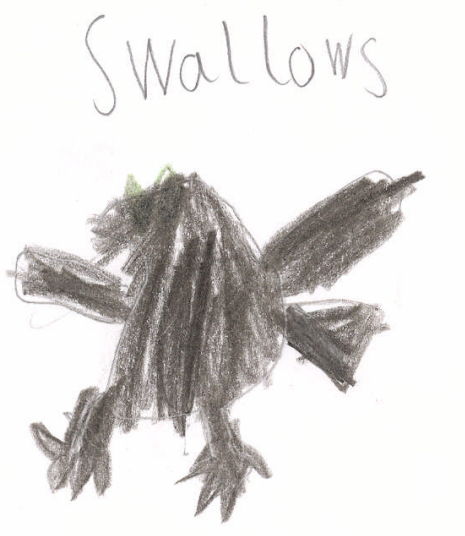
I fly back to the barn and eat it.

2. Swallows – James



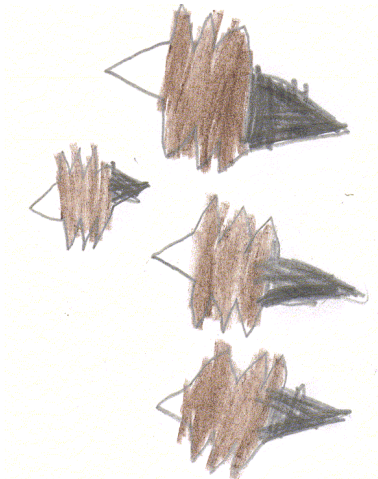
Swallows zoom quite fast.

3. Swallow – Magnus



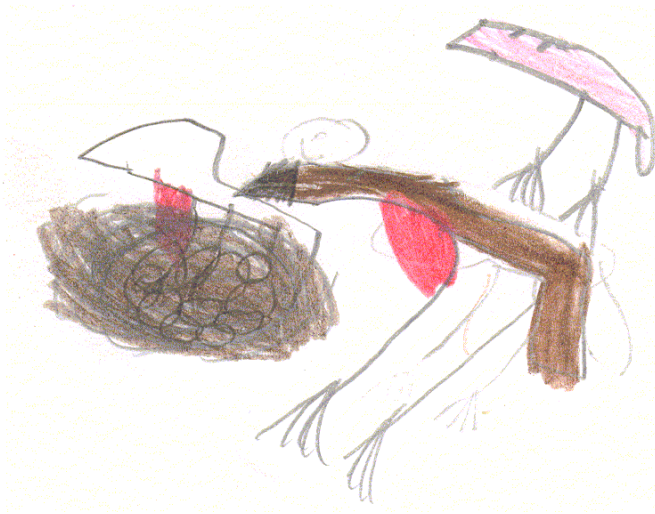
Swallow zoom about.
